gratitude. For starters, I thought it would get easier. It doesn't. I hoped to be a bestseller. I am. I thought I'd have the same crew of friends, the same agent, the same editors and publishers. I don't. I made one overarching decision early on in my career: Stay in the game. I have.

Life changes us, naturally. The creation of the work changes us, hopefully for the better, to be stronger, richer writers. Your experience with the story changes us. Some of them you adore, and some you don't. Every story that is no longer ours, but yours, as IT'S ONE OF US is about to be, comes with the same fears. Will you like it? Will you hate it?

There's no telling. So I will share with you my deepest truth. Regardless, I am grateful that you're here, that you're reading my stories, and that we have this connection. You have made me who I am, made me the writer I've become, and I don't know how to thank you for those gifts, other than to keep my head down and write you more books. Thank you for letting me. I promise I will never come lightly to the page.


